THE EDGAR "BUDDY" GALVIN BUTTERFLY GARDEN & FLIGHT 19 MEMORIAL UPDATE



The NASFL Museum will be featuring a Butterfly Garden in honor of WWII veteran and Museum member Edgar "Buddy" Galvin. Thanks to the initiative of member and Master Gardener Brendan Doyle, a veteran who lives in Dania Beach, who has assembled a team of Master Gardeners from Broward County, and working on finalizing the plans for the garden.

This garden will be an all-volunteer conservation effort. The garden will feature an assortment of plants surrounding an area of poured concrete that will represent a TBM/TBF Avenger torpedo bomber. The area will also have four picnic tables and a legend commemorating Flight 19, which will be set in the direction, in which Flight 19 took off on the fateful day of December 5, 1945.


